The 2020 Trunk or Treat event is still going to take place, it will just look a bit different due to COVID-19 social distancing and outdoor event attendance guidelines.

This year will be a DRIVE-THRU event and the location has been changed to take place at the Roscommon Middle School. You will stay in your vehicles and enter the High School drive at 10600 Oakwood Drive and follow the oneway traffic flow. The trunks will be decorated and set up on both sides of the service drive that goes from the Middle School down to the Elementary School/Bus Garage area and you will exit out to W. Sunset Drive that way. When you begin, you will be given a voting card so that the people in your vehicle can vote on their favorite decorations in three categories: Best Decorated, Most Creative and Scariest. At the end, you will hand in your voting card and each child in your vehicle will be given a large bag of candy that has been prepackaged in a sterile, safe environment. There will be no walking and trunks will not hand out the candy but will donate their candy ahead of time so that it can be pre-packaged.

This event will take place on Halloween night (October 31, 2020) from 6:00 - 7:30 p.m. If you plan on decorating your vehicle, registration and vehicle line-up will begin at 4:15 p.m.
