Weather Watch

On May 4th, Gerrish Township and Roscommon County
Emergency Management hosted a free Weather Spotter
Training Class at the Gerrish Township Hall. The class was
presented by the National Weather Service Gaylord Office and
we had a great turn out of 25 attendees. Little did we know, or
they know, that about two weeks later an EF-3 rated tornado
would touch down in Gaylord!

Maximum winds of 150 mph ripped roofs of buildings, flipped cars, killed two people and injured 44 people as it tore through the town. Michigan averages about 15 tornadoes per year and it's very rare to see a tornado in northern Michigan. The governor declared a state of emergency as several local and state agencies arrived to help with victim support, clean up, medical treatment, police services, utility services, etc. This should be a wake-up call for all of us living in Northern Michigan that these storms can happen and we should know the early warning signs and how to prepare for such emergencies. Tornadoes develop when there is a change in wind direction and an increase in wind speed with increasing height. This creates an invisible, horizontal spinning effect in the lower atmosphere. Rising air within a thunderstorm updraft tilts the rotating air from horizontal to vertical causing a violently rotating column of air extending from the thunderstorm to the ground. In other words, you must have

If you are inside a building, go to the lowest floor or basement away from windows. If an underground shelter is not available, move to a small interior room or hallway on the lowest floor. Mobile homes, even if tied down, offer little protection from tornadoes, leave the mobile home and go to a nearby building if possible. If caught outdoors or in a vehicle, try to seek shelter inside a building, if you don't have time to exit your vehicle, stay inside with your seat belt fastened and

lift and rotation to develop tornado funnels.
