Weather Watch

WINDS/HAIL/FLOODING

This is the time of year for thunderstorms which can produce straight-line winds and hail. Most wind damage from thunderstorms are caused by straight-line winds which can exceed 100 mph! One type of straight-line wind is a downburst which is a small area of rapidly descending air beneath a thunderstorm and can cause damage equivalent to a tornado and is extremely dangerous to aviation. A "dry microburst" is a downburst that occurs with little or no rain, however these are more prevalent in the western United States.

Strong rising air within a storm, called updrafts, carry water droplets to a height where freezing occurs. Ice particles grow in size, becoming too heavy to be supported by the updraft and fall to the ground as hail. Large hail stones can fall at speeds greater than 100 mph and reach diameters over a half a foot, causing substantial property damage and potential for injury or even loss of life in extreme cases.

Floods and flash floods can occur anywhere with heavy amounts of rainfall and are more common in watershed areas or along river banks that overflow. Floods are the number one cause of deaths associated with thunderstorms resulting in more than 140 fatalities every year in the U.S. Most of these fatalities occur at night and most victims are people who become trapped in automobiles. It only takes six inches of fast moving water to knock you off your feet and a depth of two feet will cause most vehicles to float. Always avoid driving over water covered roadways as the depth of the water and undercurrents may be deceiving.
