## ACT NOW AED Refurbishment Project



On January 22, 2024, three Gerrish Township businesses received Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) through ACT NOW's "AED Refurbishment Project" and the Gerrish Township Police Department.

When Gerrish Township PD recently replaced their three Cardiac Science AEDs that they carried in their patrol units, they donated them to ACT NOW who in turn purchased new cases, new batteries, new pads and supplies for each AED unit refurbishing them to functional units. There was not anything wrong with these units, they were replaced due to newer technology and compatibility with Gerrish EMS ambulance monitors.

The cost for the project was \$1,208.69 to update all three AED units. These units are still available for purchase new at a cost of \$1,445.00 each (plus supplies and case). This is a savings of approximately \$1,847.00 to each business. The ACT NOW Executive Board selected the businesses that would receive the units based on their location, population influx and type of business.

These business owners/operators were given a quick tutorial on the use of the AED and will be able to train their staff members if the need ever arises. AEDs are used when a person suffers cardiac arrest and if used quickly and in conjunction with CPR, provides the best possible outcome for survival. FEBRUARY is American Heart Month, a time when everyone - especially women - are encouraged to focus on their cardiovascular health.

This year's Heart Month is focusing on women to listen to their hearts and speak up for their health. According to the CDC's Division for Heart Disease and Stroke Prevention (DHDSP), women in the US are experiencing unacceptable and avoidable heart-related illness and death and nearly half of US women do not recognize that heart disease is the leading cause of death for women.

The American Heart Association states that women are less likely than men to receive CPR from a bystander if they experience cardiac arrest. The biggest reason male rescuers would refrain from giving CPR to a woman was fear of being accused of sexual assault or inappropriate touching and women might not provide CPR assistance for fear of causing physical injury to the victim. In a 2018 study, 45% of men received bystander CPR compared with only 39% of women and men had 23% higher odds of survival than women.

Many people believe that women are less likely to have heart problems or suffer cardiac arrest...here is what the American Heart Association is doing:

- 1) Raising awareness about cardiac arrest in women.
- 2) Improving training to address gender-related barriers to increase bystander CPR rates for women including practicing on female manikins.
- 3) Advocating to improve the response to cardiac arrest for everyone (all states have Good Samaritan laws that protect bystanders who render first aid and CPR).

Here's what you can do:

- 1) Overcome fear of providing CPR on anyone, it may help save a life.
- 2) Learn Hands-Only CPR or take a CPR Course.
