### JUNE is National Safety Month

June is recognized every year as National Safety Month, mostly for the workplace, however, it is also the perfect motivation to suggst some proactive safety measures in the home.

Parents and others with children or those with aging parents, might be interested in creating a Home Safety Plan. Consider some of these main points when creating a safety plan for home:

- FIRE SAFETY This is a critical point in safety, starting with preventative measures such as smoke detectors, fire extinguishers and an evacuation plan in case of a fire including identifying two meeting places in case of an emergency.
- EMERGENCY KIT Keeping everyone safe in an emergency is important whether the emergency is the result of a natural disaster such as a tornado, flood or wildfire or the outcome of human acts. Be sure that your emergency kit includes supplies such as flashlights with batteries, fresh drinking water, shelf stable foods, first aid kit, extra medications, cell phone chargers and pet foods.
- GET SMARTPHONE ALERTS Today it is easier than ever to be notified in cases of emergency in your local area. Code Red, the National Weather Service and the Gerrish PD Mobile App are all great ways to receive alerts and notifications in real time.
- PREPARE KIDS AND ELDERS Education and knowledge is the best way to help everyone keep their cool and know what to do in an emergency. Practice your safety plan frequently, make sure important phone numbers are memorized and that everyone knows what to do whether they are at home or away.

## **ORV Laws & County Ordinance**

Summer is here, time to remind everyone about the Roscommon County ORV Ordinance and ORV laws. Here are the highlights:

- ORVs can operate on the far right side of a roadway except on state or federal highways such as M-18, M-55, US 127 & I-75.
- Speed no more than 25 mph or a lower posted speed.
- · With the flow of traffic single file.
- Must possess a valid driver's license or a Michigan issued ORV safety certificate (ages 12-16).
- Child less than 16 years of age and possesses a valid ORV safety certificate must be under the direct visual supervision of an adult at all times.
- Must wear helmets and protective eye wear unless the vehicle is equipped with a roof that meets or exceeds standards for a crash helmet (adults only).
- If vehicle is equipped all passengers and operator will wear properly adjusted and fitted safety belts.

Gerrish Officers will be stopping violators of any of the above items and citations may be issued. For a complete copy of the Roscommon County ORV Ordinance No. 4 and Map, visit
