During National Suicide Prevention Month, we would like to promote the use of gun locks and other safe storage methods to prevent firearm suicide by creating time and distance between a person in crisis and a firearm. Properly storing guns, and ammunition in a separate location can help prevent accidental and intentional deaths. America's deadliest shootings are the ones we don't talk enough about, over half of all gun deaths in the U.S. are suicides. We lose 74 people to gun suicide every day in America more than are lost to firearm homicides and unintentional shootings combined. 75% of youth firearm suicides occurred with guns that were stored loaded and unlocked.

Safe firearm storage is key to saving lives.

Take a moment to learn about the warning signs of a person in crisis and feel confident in reaching out to them for support. Refer anyone contemplating suicide to call or text 988 or visit 988lifeline.org to reach the free and confidential suicide crisis service.

Through a generous donation from "Project Child Safe" the Gerrish Twp. Police Department has **FREE** gun locks available to anyone who would like them. There is not a limit on how many you can take. We need to work



together to keep firearms safely and securely stored and save lives!
