As our Department reviews its goals and objectives from 2023-2026, we are quite pleased that we have been on point for several of the targeted areas. We have not been fully staffed since these goals and objectives were established and we are happy to announce that our staffing goal of maintaining a stable and experienced staff is coming to fruition.

We have strived to keep up with the latest strategies for recruiting and retention in the police profession by implementing an Academy Sponsorship Program and obtaining funding for the program through the State of Michigan Public Safety Academy Assistance Programs.

With some of the change over in staffing from the past few years of retirements and resignations,

2026 will bring a combined law enforcement experience of 79 years, most of these years are attributed to 20 years for Chief Muszynski, 22 years for Lt. Schutte and 27 years for Officer McGeary. If we add in the other officers totaling 10 years and our Administrative Clerk's 44 years, it brings the Department total to 123 years of service that we proudly offer to our community.

We continue flourishing and nurturing the Community Policing philosophy and encourage all staff to participate in community events. We continue to work closely with ACT NOW (non-profit organization that works with GTPD to benefit our community) and support their mission and the many annual programs and projects they sponsor.

CERT VOLUNTEERS HELP PROVIDE CRITICAL SUPPORT BY GIVING IMMEDIATE ASSISTANCE TO VICTIMS, PROVIDING DAMAGE ASSESSMENT INFORMATION, AND ORGANIZING OTHER VOLUNTEERS AT DISASTER SITES. THEY WORK UNDER THE DIRECTION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY RESPONDERS AND MAY AT TIMES RESPOND TO REQUESTS FROM OUTSIDE OF OUR LOCAL AREA. THEIR TRAINING IS DESIGNED TO COVER DISASTER PREPAREDNESS, FIRE SAFETY & EXTINGUISHING, PATIENT TRIAGE & ASSESSMENT, PATIENT TREATMENT & HYGIENE, LIGHT SEARCH & RESCUE, TEAM ORGANIZATION, DISASTER PSYCHOLOGY & TERRORISM AND INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM & RADIO COMMUNICATIONS.
